Each group outside Winnipeg is encouraged to be included in their municipality or town's insurance to ensure each volunteer is covered for general liability. A policy to this affect will be developed by the board and communicated in the new year.

• MB COPP constitution and bylaws

Now that MB COPP is incorporated, the constitution and bylaws are being reviewed to ensure they are consistent with the Manitoba Corporations Act. The MB COPP board is working diligently to ensure compliance and you can expect the new bylaws to be presented at the next AGM in 2017.
